Picture Yourself as a Health Professional: Each summer, the UW School of Medicine's Office of Multicultural Affairs offers a unique opportunity for high school sophomores and juniors to experience health professions in medicine and dentistry. **U-DOC is a five-week residential high school summer enrichment program that seeks to foster, affirm and encourage interest in healthcare professions.**

U-DOC is intended for students who are from disadvantaged backgrounds (economic, geographic, education) and/or students who are under-represented in medicine (racial and ethnic populations that are under-represented in the medical profession relative to their numbers in the general population.)

Students who expect to encounter significant barriers in achieving their education and professional goals will benefit from U-DOC.
