At the U-Dub:

Picture Yourself as a Health Professional: Each summer, the UW School of Medicine's Office of Multicultural Affairs offers a unique opportunity for high school sophomores and juniors to experience health professions in medicine and dentistry. **U-DOC is a five-week residential high school summer enrichment program that seeks to foster, affirm and encourage interest in healthcare professions.** U-DOC is intended for students who are from disadvantaged backgrounds (economic, geographic, education) and/or students who are under-represented in medicine (racial and ethnic populations that are under-represented in the medical profession relative to their numbers in the general population.) Students who expect to encounter significant barriers in achieving their education and professional goals will benefit from U-DOC. 2010 TEENS IN PUBLIC SERVICE (TIPS) SUMMER INTERNSHIP

The 2010 Teens in Public Service (TIPS) summer internship application is available to Bellevue High School students. TIPS hires teens-ages 15-19 and gives them **paid** summer internships working at non-profit organizations working in the Greater Seattle area. TIPS interns work to provide affordable housing and services to the homeless, tutor at-risk youth, gain hands-on experience in the medical, science and environmental fields, and provide cultural enrichment and educational opportunities to children and families. In addition to their work schedules, TIPS interns participate in leadership trainings, service activities, and public speaking events. After completion, the application is submitted via our website (Preferred method). **All applications are due on Friday, March 26, 2010** along with two letters of recommendations. Due to the competitive nature of the TIPS application process, we are unable to accept any late submissions. Students must be 15 years old by June 1, 2010.
