GRADUATION TICKETS:

As has been the process for many years, the number of graduation tickets available to graduates is weather dependant and as follows:

Sunny and in the stadium – each graduate will receive 6 tickets.

- 2) Tickets will be distributed to seniors on or after Wednesday, June 9th or when there is a reasonable assurance from weather forecasts that the ceremony will be in the stadium.
 - 3) Additional tickets, as requested, will be distributed during the Senior Breakfast on the 15th of June.
Inclement weather (rain) forecast as of June 9th – each graduate will receive 4 tickets. Additional tickets will be available as the gym seating capacity dictates the number of available tickets.
 - 4) Should the weather change for the good and the ceremony is in the stadium, additional tickets will be distributed during the Senior Breakfast.

ATTENTION SENIORS AND THEIR PARENTS: POST GRADUATE PLANS AND MAILING OF FINAL TRANSCRIPTS

Wednesday, May 19th and Thursday, May 20th, Counselors visited Senior Government classes to explain the process for having their final transcripts (containing 2nd semester grades) sent to the college or university they plan to attend next year. Each Senior was given a yellow form entitled "Graduate Information Survey" where they list what their post-graduate plans are for next year (attending college, employment, military, undecided). The completed forms are on file in the Counseling Center and will be used to determine where each student's final transcript should be sent as well as to provide statistics for the school profile. If seniors are currently undecided on their plans, or their plans change, they should contact the Counseling Center to submit the changes no later than Wednesday, June 16th. Remember, the building will be closed over the summer! Final transcripts are tentatively scheduled to be mailed (no fee for this) to colleges/universities by July 1st, or as soon as they are available. WONDERING ABOUT PARKING FOR 2010-11 SCHOOL YEAR?

The new parking program at Bellevue High School addresses a 40 percent reduction in available parking on campus during the construction phase beginning September 2010 through January 2012.

Student parking spaces will be made available to students who register as carpools. Each carpool team must include four students (with the potential for three students with evidence of extenuating circumstances). At least two of those students must be licensed drivers. Each carpool team is given one registered parking pass. The pass will be numbered and must hang from the visor of the vehicle when it is on campus. The pass can be utilized by any licensed driver within the carpool using any of their registered vehicles. Parking permits can be purchased for \$100 beginning June 7. Students are encouraged to share the cost with licensed drivers in the carpool.
