### **WONDERING ABOUT PARKING FOR 2010-11 SCHOOL YEAR?**

The new parking program at Bellevue High School addresses a 40 percent reduction in available parking on campus during the construction phase beginning September 2010 through January 2012.

Student parking spaces will be made available to students who register as carpools. Each carpool team must include four students (with the potential for three students with evidence of extenuating circumstances). At least two of those students must be licensed drivers. Each carpool team is given one registered parking pass. The pass will be numbered and must hang from the visor of the vehicle when it is on campus. The pass can be utilized by any licensed driver within the carpool using any of their registered vehicles. Parking applications can be picked up from the counter in the Activities Office.
